Greetings in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ. What a great month June was at Augustana. This month of graduations and celebrations ended with great stories, play and excitement. The "Best is Yet To Come" theatrical presentation featuring the stories and voices of our elders at Augustana filled the sanctuary. The annual Church Picnic was outstanding with lots of food and water in various forms; and the ecumenical Vacation Bible School where the voices of so many children raised the roof of the sanctuary with joy! I love VBS, it always brings back memories of singing "I've got the joy, joy, joy, down in my heart . . . I've got the love of Jesus, love of Jesus, down in my heart" as a child at St. Mark's.

This gift of community that the Holy Spirit has given us is something that gives life and is a gift that we are called to share. For many would be lifted by it if they only knew what a faith community is really like. We know the difference it makes in our own lives. This is especially true if we have been away from it for a while and then return.

This gift of a faith community is especially important in this day in which we live. The oil spill in the gulf (please see Bishop Hansen's letter), oppressive laws against sisters and brothers (please see the EMO press release on the Arizona law), two wars still raging, an economic system that is in flux with many facing crisis and the gap of wealth ever growing, racial inequity in the judicial system, health and society at large all point to the need we have to be inspired to not grow tired in doing good and effecting systemic change so that all might have life. The gift of faith inspires us to go out in joy and return in

peace each and every day as we see the importance of the ministry of our daily lives.

As I reflect on the Sunday readings for July and August one can only be inspired and hopeful with the word of God placed before us. In July alone from the readings in the Gospel of Luke we have the themes, "Ask the Lord of the Harvest to send out laborers" Luke 10:2; followed by the question, "Who is my neighbor?" in Luke 10:29; and then the story of Mary and Martha where **Mary sat at the Lord's feet and listened** from Luke 10:39; followed by the wonderful words of Jesus about the power of prayer and action, "Ask, and it will be given you; seek and you will find; knock and the door will be opened unto you!"

This summer as members and friends of the Augustana community gather here and in other places, and as visitors join us from around the world we will publish each week the readings for each Sunday in our email messages. Those readings are listed in the newsletter as well. Wherever the Spirit leads you this summer, to sit by the sea or to climb a mountain, a walk along a river or a hike in the desert, a visit to another house of prayer for worship or being present in God's house of prayer for all people here at Augustana, may you meditate on and enjoy the word of God. It will give you strength and hope, faith and joy for the journey of love that God has called you to, as part of this community of faith.

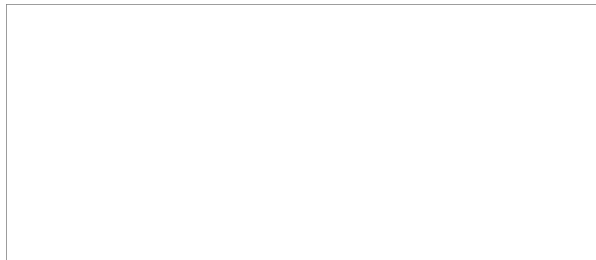
