Then the angel showed me the river of the water of life, bright as crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

Revelation 22:1-2

In the last verses of the last book of the Bible, we hear these wonderful words about the leaves of the tree being for the healing of the nations.

On the coffee table in my office are two ceramic leaves that I bought in the Holy Land at an art gallery in September of 2005, I can't believe it has been 13 years! The gallery was in a village outside of Nazareth as we were headed for the Sea of Galilee. We were a delegation of Christian and Jewish leaders who were meeting with Muslim, Jewish and Christian leaders. One evening we had dinner with the Interfaith Council of Jerusalem. This was a very critical time in the land, since Gaza had been turned back to the Palestinians two weeks before we arrived and Hurricane Katrina had just occurred the week before we arrived.

We were at the art gallery to have lunch with five mayors, Muslim and Jewish, and to dialogue about what was next. The gallery was owned by a Muslim artist and his exhibit called "From Wounds to Healing" displayed the works of seven Jewish, seven Muslim and seven Christian artists. The leaves on my coffee table are from the exhibit. Yes, the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the Nations.

Later this month the Riverside Church in New York will have a sendoff celebration for their Pastor Emeritus and our friend the Rev. Dr. James Forbes who will be moving back to North Carolina after many years in New York. Dr. Forbes has been called by Newsweek Magazine one of the 12 greatest preachers in the land as well as one of the best ever by Ebony Magazine. Dr. Forbes preached at Augustana with an overflow of 800 people in a memorable service in the summer of 2004 as part of a Nationwide "Let Justice Roll" Voter Registration Campaign led by the National Council of Churches and in Oregon by the Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon.

That night Dr. Forbes underscored the importance of every faith community in our democratic process. Over the past decade Dr. Forbes established the "Healing of the Nations" effort at Union Seminary in New York. Yes, as this modern-day prophet taught, the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

Augustana, you are part of the leaves of the tree for the healing of the Nations. Enclosed in this Newscaster is a brochure on the Wholeness and Healing Ministries of Augustana. Along with members of our Health Servant Team we commend this resource to you. It covers a wide range of offerings from personal care to Advocacy. Yes, we are here for the healing and wholeness of every person and yes, for the healing of the nations.

Looking ahead we will continue to speak out together for the common good and in this month of October will encourage voter registration and participation in the process leading up to the November elections. The passage of the Portland Clean Energy Fund ballot measure led by communities of color and faith communities like ours will be important. The defeat of the anti-immigrant Measure 105 will be equally so. There is a good possibility of a major rally for this on Sunday evening, October 15. This will be determined in the coming days. Yes, the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

Yes the church, Augustana and all others in the name of Christ have the River of Life flowing through us ... and we exist for the sake of the world, the healing and wholeness of every person and the healing of the nations.

Registration is now open for EMO's 2018 Collins Summit exploring the causes, challenges and opportunities of human migration in an increasingly global society. The event will include an afternoon seminar with a plenary and workshop sessions followed by an evening lecture by **The Rev. 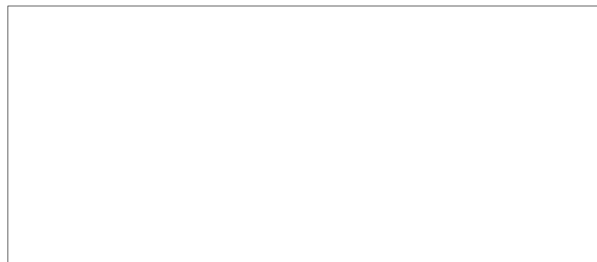
