This year's stewardship theme, "**Stewards of God's Love**," is drawn from the great commandment that Jesus taught us. As a basis for this year's stewardship education at Augustana we will be using the church-wide resource by that name which was sent to all 11,000 congregations of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA), from Puerto Rico to Alaska.

Presiding Bishop Mark Hansen wrote about this resource in a letter of introduction, "As members of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, we believe that we are freed in Christ to serve and love our neighbor. Our generosity in stewarding our time, talents and treasures is an expression of love for God and for our neighbor." As Bishop Hansen has served the church as presiding Bishop these past 12 years with great energy in stewarding God's gifts, we know that incoming Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will be leading the way as well as a servant steward leader empowered by the Holy Spirit.

Stewards of God's Love is a theme that ties the generations together in the ministry that we have been called to. With the celebration of All Saints Sunday we remember that the church exists in heaven and on earth as we offer thanks to God for those who have gone before us who have set the firm foundation for ministry in our day, even as they now cheer us on.

Stewards of God's Love reminds that our generation has a vital calling to be the

church in our day even as we welcomed three new babies into the congregation in one week in October. We know that our calling to offer our time, talents and treasures beyond what we might even now imagine is important in outreach to those who are longing to hear the Good News of God's love we have experienced in Jesus Christ.

Stewards of God's Love is a theme that calls us during our Cornerstone II Visioning and Dreaming to now put the resources forward together to move into the next decade emboldened in the ministry that we have been called to. This Stewardship Season at Augustana will include Bible Studies and the sharing of stories in many settings that will inspire us to be the church that Christ calls us to be walking in Faith, Hope, and Love.

Each of us has an important part to play. Please prayerfully consider your tithe and offerings for the coming year, filling out your pledge card (enclosed) and placing it in the offering or in the mail. Pledges will be dedicated on Sunday, December 15. May God bless each of you as you hear the call of Christ and claim your role as followers to love God, yourself and your neighbor with all that you have, as you have been blessed immeasurably by God's love.

Progress Report: Cornerstone II

On Sunday, September 29 we held one combined worship service at 10:00 a.m. followed by a Cornerstone II video and reports. Members and friends then went to a project fair to sign up for working groups. To review the May 5th Cornerstone voting results, visit www.Augustana.org and click on the main page. The goal of Cornerstone II is to create a five-year plan for the growth and development of our church internally and in our service to the community and world.

Cornerstone Phases Completed
February: Training Team assembled and trained; **February-April:** Thirteen visioning workshops held for congregation and community partners, resulting in 20 hours of visioning, 110 flip charts containing 785 visions/ideas/goals; **May 5:** Report to Congregation and voting to prioritize 785 visions/ideas; **June 6:** Team reported to Church Council with voting results and top priorities; **Summer 2013:** Assess current capacity to accomplish top priorities, create new council committees to begin Action Plans for each goal/priority; top priorities sorted and collated into Action Plan committees; **September 29:** Com-

bined service and Cornerstone Reporting.

Next Steps, Fall/Winter 2013-2014
October-January: Working Groups meet; **January 2014:** Report to Congregation at Annual Meeting achievement of goals to date and review/timeline for completion of goals 2014-2018.

There will be Mission Moments, Bible Studies, sermons, and **Dedication of Pledges on Sunday, December 15.** Our goal is to have over 100 households pledge this year.

Christmas Boxes for House of Zion Lutheran

Church: The early December date is being finalized for packing Christmas food boxes for House of Zion Lutheran Church in Woodburn. For the past fourteen years Augustana has helped Zion to provide Christmas food boxes for 200 to 300 migrant

families, and this year Zion needs our help more than ever. We have helped by providing fresh chickens at a cost of nearly \$900.00, 1000 bags of candy and cash to buy extra non-perishable food such as rice and tomato sauce. House of Zion provides the majority of the non-perishable foods and distributes the boxes to the families. Volunteers from Augustana will gather at House of Zion in Woodburn to pack the boxes. This important ministry of providing for the food needs of these families also provides an opportunity to spend an enjoyable few hours with members of Augustana doing the Lord's work along with the members of House of Zion. We will **meet at House of Zion at 10:00 a.m.,** and the packing is usually finished in about three hours. Watch for more details in the November bulletins. Augustana Foundation Update

As reported to you in the last Newscaster, the Augustana Foundation meets regularly to administer bequests and memorial contributions received by the congregation. In particular this year, the Foundation has contributed substantially to the remodeling of the Youth Room, and with you we look forward to its upcoming dedication.

When the Foundation Board meets, it focuses separately on the two Foundation funds, namely the Memorials and Gifts Fund and the Endowment Fund. While the Memorials and Gifts Fund typically receives contributions in memory of Augustana members who have died, the Endowment Fund's source of funds is from individuals who have remembered the congregation in

their wills. The Memorials and Gifts fund has a healthy cash balance, and the Board is excited at the prospect of using some of it to assist in accomplishing the goals set by the recently completed Cornerstone Project.

The Foundation Board has been particularly interested this year in monitoring the status of the Endowment Fund. The cash in that Fund is invested in a socially responsible fund managed by the ELCA. Although its balance varies over time, the Board is happy to report that since the account's creation in August 2010, its market value has increased by almost 20%. This account pays a quarterly dividend currently set at an annual rate of 4.25%. We use that distribution to support causes we have identified as in keeping with our mission.

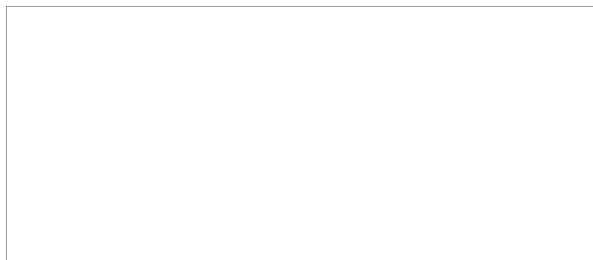
