Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to all of you as we begin the year of 2014 together at Augustana. We are coming out of a Christmas celebration that brought over a thousand people to Augustana for our four Christmas services as we sang carols and lifted our candles high amidst the wonderful poetic words of Luke's account of the birth of Christ.

We are now in the 12 days of Christmas as I write this article, a time when we rejoice that "the Word became flesh and dwelt among us . . . full of grace and truth." This is always refreshing good news in the Christian community and centers us for a new year of ministry together.

On Monday, January 6 we will celebrate the day of Epiphany when we underscore that this good news of God's presence of grace and truth in Jesus is for all nations and all creation. It is a season of celebrating the inclusiveness of God's love in Christ. Epiphany means manifestation, and this is a season that Jesus came for all people. Three great stories of Epiphany are the Magi's adoration of the Christ child, the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan, and Jesus' first miracle of turning water into wine. These are stories of joy.

Epiphany is a good season to remember that when we declare that we are a multinational, multicultural, welcoming and affirming congregation of justice seekers and peacemakers, we are declaring who we are and who we are becoming, born of the Word made flesh that we celebrate at Christmas and Epiphany. Christ among us and all people is truly a story of joy. This year the season of Epiphany is as long as we will ever have it, run-

ning two months underscoring the world's need for the inclusive reality of God's love.

In the Lutheran Book of Worship (green hymnal) there is a canticle that speaks beautifully to this season as follows:

"Listen! You nations of the world; listen to the word of the Lord. Announce it from coast to coast; declare it to distant islands.

The Lord who has scattered Israel will gather God's people again, and God will keep watch over them as a shepherd watches their flock.

With shouts of joy they will come, their faces radiantly happy, for the Lord is so generous to them, and showers the people with gifts.

Young women will dance for joy, and men young and old will make merry. Like a garden refreshed by the rain, they will never be in want again.

Break into shouts of great joy; Jacob is free again!

As we move forward this month with the Baptism of our Lord, our annual Martin Luther King Jr. celebration, the week of Christian Unity, our Interfaith Collaborations and our Annual Meeting and Ministry Celebration, we do so knowing that our calling is to share the Good News that Jesus, the Word made flesh came to live among us full of God's grace and truth. This is good news for all people.

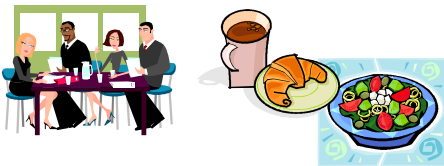

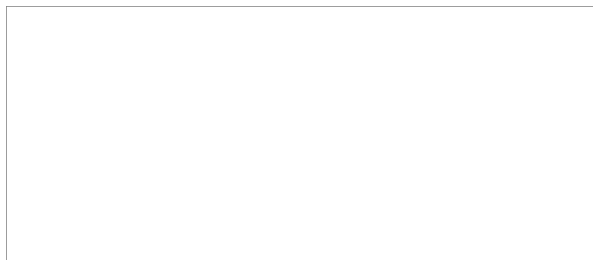
