(Jesus said:) "You are the salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven." Matthew 5:13-20

We passed a budget and gave thanks for the work of Mark and Paula Foat, Elliot Williams and Jenny Schmidt, all of whom went off the council after completing their terms, and Judy Embler who completed her two terms on the Foundation. We re-elected Andrea Robideau and Mike Balkovich to the council along with new members Jenomi Montgom-

ery, Fiona and Duncan Taylor, and Gabrielle and Ken Petersen. We re-elected Dennis Brooks to the Foundation and elected Kyle Iboshi as a new Foundation board member. Roseta Akin facilitated a great meeting, and we celebrated the ministry of all the members and friends of Augustana in 2013 and focused our energies on 2014.

February is Black History Month and forums will be held each Sunday focusing on Black History. A special jazz/gospel service will be held in February. This will be a great lead-in to the next four Cornerstone Sessions and the beginning of Lent, with Ash Wednesday on March 5.

February will also include a trip to the State Legislature on February 14 with our advocacy team.

The year before us promises to be a great year of servant ministry at Augustana. Yes, you are salt and you are light reflecting the love and light of Christ. May we journey deeper together in our discipleship as followers of Jesus.

Annual Meeting Highlights

On Sunday, January 26, another wonderful Annual Meeting and celebration was held at Augustana. The day began with one inspiring combined worship service at 10 a.m., with leaders from all four services. This was followed by a potluck and meeting from 11:30 a.m.-1:30 p.m. The sermon was "Can You Hear Jesus' Call: Follow Me." Attendance at the annual meeting was outstanding, with 138 people participating.

Those completing their terms of service on Council and Foundation were thanked for their service by Pastor Knutson. They included Council members Mark and Paula Foat, Jenny Schmidt, and Elliot Williams; and Foundation member Judy Emblar. Thank-you's to all were led by Pastor Knutson and Council members distributed flowers to all present.

Key reports were shared from Pastor Knutson; Augustana's Congregation President Roseta Akin; Foundation representative Judy Emblar, and an extensive Annual Report booklet was distributed (thank you to Joyce Kindschuh); copies are available in the church office. The congregation heard financial updates from Treasurer Mark Foat and Financial Secretaries John Wacker and Michael Hayes, and the 2014 budget was passed unanimously in the amount of \$456,693.

2013 Highlights included: Average worship attendance rose to 280; 28 new members were received; congregation grew to 820 disciples; 8 baptisms; 4 weddings; 8 funerals; 5 First Communions; 5 Confirmations. 2013 income was \$440,267; expenditures totaled \$427,072. \$24,503 went to benevolence ministries beyond our congregation, including \$14,000 to the Oregon Synod.

We celebrated that the programs and servant ministries of Augustana are thriving and we are ready for a great year of sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ in 2014!

Cornerstone II progress was presented by Kerstin Cathcart; the next events are training sessions on March 4.

Elected to the church council were Jenomi Montgomery, Gabrielle and Ken Petersen, and Fiona and Duncan Taylor. Re-elected were Andrea Robideau and Mike Balkovich. **Elected** to the Foundation was Kyle Iboshi. Re-elected was Dennis Brooks.

Pastor Knutson shared that we have a number of new things that took place in 2013 and 2014 will continue to unfold in wonderful spirit-filled ways. It was noted that we had 242 worship services at Augustana, and Christmas attendance was over 1,200 among four services as we continue to serve and give ourselves away in Jesus' name for the good of all.

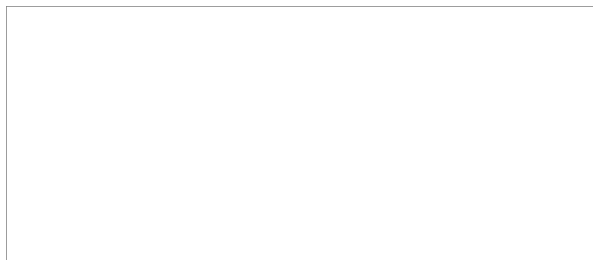
