Last night I came back to the church for an Open House for the Community Alliance of Tenants (CAT). CAT, as you know, is one of the six amazing non-profits that are part of our Augustana Ministry Collaborative that includes many church servant teams as well as our non-profits and numerous community partners.

As I came in the door around 6:00 p.m. there was a family waiting for me, two adults and two children, ages 8 and 2-1/2. They are a wonderful family that we have assisted over the years since the 8-year-old was born. Life has not been easy on them. The jobs come and go, and so does the housing and the stability. The father committed a felony many, many years ago, but even though one does the time, that record keeps coming up, and has made life more difficult than most can imagine. On this night they had been forced out of where they were living for fear of another, and were desperate just to find a place where they could let their little girl and boy sleep.

As is often the case at Augustana, one agenda had to be dropped, celebrating the work of CAT, the only low-income tenants rights organization in the state, for another more pressing need, a family without a home. As we talked and made phone calls together it was readily apparent that nothing was available. There were no family shelters with beds available, municipal agencies were closed (most of the time funds for emergencies are not available anyway) and the only hope this weary family, whose car had broken down on the west side had, forcing them to walk in the heat, was this church on 15th where they had received help from our team before.

On this night the only option available was to get the family a hotel room with some money for food, and meetings in the morning for longer term assistance. When I returned to the church later that

evening after getting them to the motel I was walking through the building, closing things for the night and I saw a picture drawn in chalk on a chalkboard in the upstairs kitchen, life-size of a little girl. The words under the picture read, "God, please help our family find stable housing." It had been drawn by the 8-year-old girl while her mother had been preparing a bottle for her brother, and her father had been exploring possibilities with me.

Jesus said, "Come to me, all you that are weary, and I will give you rest." These words are for you and me, our friends from last night, and every human being on the face of the earth. You are also the body of Christ. Because of each of you and the grace of God, this congregation exists in the heart of the city to be a refuge for the weary, a place of hope to at least catch one's breath. At the same time, this congregation exists to advocate in our society for a just and equitable world where systems and laws and economics are changed so that no family should find themselves in such a hopeless situation.

Summer is here. May we reach out and lift up those who are hurting, may we contemplate what it means to be a community of compassion, may we stand up and speak out with those who are most vulnerable, and may we hear God's call for renewal and refreshment that we may continue to bloom and grow as the servant church in the heart of the city where Christ's love is alive and ever-present for all.

New Banners in the Sanctuary!

This spring and early summer our sanctuary has been graced with new banners along the wall for both the Easter season and Pentecost Sunday, and now the season of Pentecost. Many members participated in the creation of these and we offer a special thanks to JillMichelle Cosart who led the process.

Cornerstone II: Projects are moving in many areas, and the Ways and Means Team has met twice with Chris Tomlinson hosting. These have been wonderful meetings as plans and strategies are set to provide the resources for the various projects. Teams already at work include Worship & Music, Pipe Organ,

Stewardship, Communication, Advocacy, Health Ministry, Ways and Means, and Church Facilities Audit. Coming soon is the new Human Resources Team. All of these will help us with the 5-10 year plans that may lead to a capital campaign. Stewardship Tree PHASE 2 Begins
Stewardship Tree Phase 1 is complete. Between mid-March and mid-July we recorded 326 hours of stewardship given by Augustana members. 36% of the stewardship activity benefitted the greater community and 64% were efforts to keep Augustana up and running and fulfilling our mission.

Phase 2 is very similar to phase 1, but with flowers instead of leaves. This phase will last until September and the stewardship committee is encouraging all of us to continue to do those activi-

ties that keep Augustana strong and vibrant. We know that not everyone put every hour of service on the tree in phase 1. As we go into the summer, let's fill the tree and also look for new ways to be involved, new ways to teach our children about stewardship and look for times to make new friends. One way is to come to the Saturday Work Party breakfast from 8 to 9 am, have a great breakfast and spend an hour doing tasks around Augustana (lots of yard work as well as indoor projects). It's a way to make new friends, or to bring a friend along.

Please mark your calendars, save the date, and plan to attend the upcoming Stewardship lunch, Sunday, November 2 from 12:30 to 2:00 p.m. This time will allow for families with children, elderly who do not wish to drive at night and all of the community to gather for food, fellowship and fun. 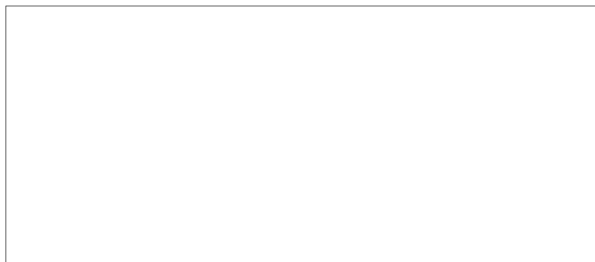
