Augustana Lutheran Church Good Newscaster - January 2015

The mission of Augustana Lutheran Church is to witness to the Good News of God in Jesus Christ as a multicultural and multinational congregation of justice-seekers and peacemakers who welcome and affirm every person.

"In those days Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee and was baptized by John in the Jordan. And just as he was coming up out of the water, he saw the heavens torn apart and the Spirit descending like a dove on him. And a voice came from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved; with you I am well pleased." Mark 1:9-11

This reading from the book of Mark, our primary Gospel source for 2015, of the baptism of Jesus in the Jordan by John, with God announcing God's pleasure, is one of the three great stories of the season of Epiphany that we are now in. As you know, the other two are the Magi's visit to and adoration of the Christ child, and Jesus' first miracle of turning water into wine at his mother's request to keep the wedding celebration going.

These stories of revelation of who Jesus is add to the rich rhythm and experience of Advent, Christmas and Epiphany. This is an amazing faith-deepening rhythm that we are blessed to share in the life of the church. It is a rhythm that guides us with expectation and hope, joy and revelation through the longest days of winter which is truly a blessing.

As in the past, Advent and Christmas were remarkable at Augustana. The children's pageant was awesome and close to a thousand attended our four Christmas services (three candlelight services on Christmas Eve and one Carol service on Christmas Day). The joy in one another's eyes and the laughter of children and the sounds of babies was a delight. The flowing rainbow of who we are as a community that was so evident during communion was truly one of the great gifts of Christmas.

Now we are in the season of Epiphany which will carry us through the Sunday of the Transfiguration of our Lord on February 15 and into the season of Lent which begins with Ash Wednesday on February 18. These six Sundays will be full of light and revelation of who Jesus is, the Savior of the Nations. As we like to say in church, Jesus' love, compassion and forgive-

ness is not just for some, but for all. Epiphany underscores this.

We begin Epiphany on January 11 with the story of Jesus' baptism and we will celebrate two baptisms that Sunday and welcome Camp Lutherwood staff. As the movie Selma is released we will prepare to have our annual Martin Luther King Citywide Jazz Service on January 18 which we began almost two decades ago. Then on Sunday, January 25 we will have our Annual Meeting and Celebration with one joyous and inspiring combined worship service at 10:00 a.m., a potluck at 11:30, and our meeting from 12-1:30 p.m. sharp. We will recall with joy all that God did through this congregation in 2014 and look forward with boldness and hope to what God is calling us to in 2015.

Epiphany means "manifestation." The stories of faith reveal who Jesus is for all peoples and all nations. God's voice from heaven, "You are my Son, the Beloved, with whom I am well pleased" puts an exclamation mark on this Good News. As a multicultural, multinational, multigenerational servant congregation of justice-seekers and peacemakers working for Jesus' beloved community, the season of Epiphany helps to shape us as we immerse ourselves in the lifegiving waters of baptism into the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and into the powerful community and movement of the church on earth, cheered on by the church in heaven.


