³⁶ "Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?" ³⁷ Jesus said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' ³⁸ This is the greatest and first commandment. ³⁹ And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' ⁴⁰ On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets." Matthew 22:36-40

and what does the LORD require of you
but to do justice, and to love kindness,

When I began reflecting a while back on the theme for this article, I was looking at a strong evangelism message for outreach and in-reach. I was planning to challenge ourselves to take our Sunday worship attendance over 300 and to grow our vital and exciting Sunday School and Youth Ministry Programs. The basis for this is our powerful message of God's transformative love in a time when that is needed more than ever.

Then Saturday, October 27 the horrible mass shooting at Tree of Life Synagogue in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania took place in which 11 sisters and brothers died at the hands of a man filled with hate fanned by anti-Semitic, anti immigrant and racist rhetoric and more than one can describe. Our hearts were broken in this, the largest killing spree in a synagogue in American history. This followed a week when hate filled another man to send 13 pipe bombs to a former president and other leaders, and two African Americans were shot at a store because of the color of their skin, and hateful speech was being aimed at poor and vulnerable refugees on the road in Mexico.

Within hours of the shooting at Tree of Life we were contacted by Rabbi Michael Cahana (who was out of the country) and Rabbi Elizabeth Joseph of Congregation Beth Israel and the Board of Rabbis to assist in getting the word out to as many people as possible. With the thousands in our Lift Every Voice Oregon network, with our Augustana Center for Systemic Change non-profit network, with the Oregon Synod Lutheran network, with the Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon network, with the Albina Ministerial Alliance network, with the Interfaith network, with the Interfaith Alliance on Poverty network, and with the End the Death Penalty in Oregon network, among others, a lot could be done in a few hours.

To sit with many dear faith leader colleagues and elected officials and to look out from the altar area to well over 1000 people overflowing Congregation Beth Israel on Sunday afternoon October 28, gave one great hope in a time of tremendous grief. I could see many of you present from where I was sitting and am so thankful to be pastor of a congregation like ours at Augustana.

I had a similar feeling the night before at the Augustana Gala and Auction. The energy was wonderful, the generosity for vital ministries within and beyond Augustana was tremendous with over \$12,000 being raised for vital programs of Lutheran Community Services for women and children who are extremely vulnerable, and over \$10,000 for new ovens for our seven-day-a-week kitchen that feeds the world. The venue and staff who served us were amazing, and Co-Chairs Christine Grumm and Janis Bell did another off the charts job and will have a full report for the congregation when all the details are complete.

Yes love of God, love of neighbor and love of self are at the heart of our ministry at Augustana. Doing justice, loving kindness and walking humbly with God are central to our life together in this place. Now that I think about it, to underscore evangelism with outreach and in-reach is the right thing at this time at Augustana. Outreach not for the sake of growth, but for ministry in the community filled with kindness, justice and love.

In this newscaster you will find an inspiring article sent out by Portland Public Schools, celebrating such ministry in daily life in the work of Ayn Reyes Frazee, Augustana's Vice-President. Her work as a librarian is filled with love for her students. If we are going to overcome hate with love, if we are going to weave the beloved community rather than accept a divided nation, worship is the place to start. Can you imagine how many people long to hear Good News in our day. We have it to share in the Good News of God's unconditional love we have in Jesus Christ. Invite others to join us in the coming month and let love abound.

November 1: EMO's 2018 Collins Summit explores the causes, challenges and opportunities of human migration in an increasingly global society. Join a diverse group of refugees, immigrants, advocates and scholars to develop an informed and compassionate approach to human migration both within and across borders. The event includes an afternoon seminar with a plenary and workshop sessions followed by an evening lecture by **The Rev. Dr. David Vásquez-Levy**, President of the Pacific School of Religion, and **Ellen Rosenblum**, Oregon Attorney General. Afternoon topics include the causes of migration, what the journey entails, challenges faced upon arrival, and the intersectionality of community concerns such as racism, profiling and criminal justice. Afternoon events begin at 1 p.m. at St. Michael's Lutheran Church, 6700 NE 29th Ave. The evening Collins Lecture, addressing theological and legal aspects of human migration, begins at 7 p.m. in the Concordia University Gymnasium, 6430 NE 27th Ave.

Lift Every Voice Oregon, based at Augustana, now has two pieces of legislation at the Legislative Council that would ban the sale of assault weapons and large capacity magazines. More to come.

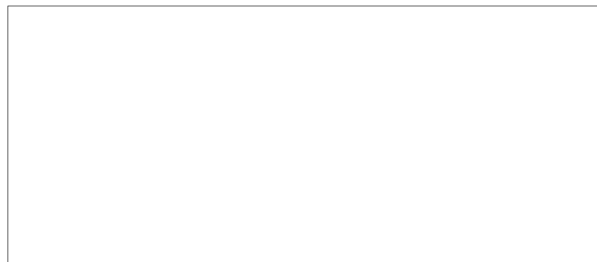
