<sup>7</sup> Jesus said to them, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. <sup>8</sup> He said to them, "Now draw some out, and take it to the chief steward." So they took it. <sup>9</sup> When the steward tasted the water that had become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the steward called the bridegroom <sup>10</sup> and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and then the inferior wine after the guests have become drunk. But you have kept the good wine until now." <sup>11</sup> Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him. *John 2:7-11*

After an incredible series of three services Christmas Eve and one Christmas Day, we are primed for Epiphany. In this New Year of our Lord 2019 we begin with the Epiphany of our Lord on Sunday, January 6, followed by the Baptism of our Lord on Sunday, January 13. We then come to the second Sunday after Epiphany, January 20, where Jesus performs his first miracle at the request of his mother Mary.

At the wedding at Cana, Jesus turns the water into wine that the celebration might go on. As the steward points out, the best was then served last. As we lift up regularly in the faith community, whether times are dismal and depressing or bright and joyful, with Jesus the best is always yet to come.

As we enter the season of Epiphany in 2019 we will continue to step out boldly in faith, knowing that Jesus the light of the world shines as bright as ever. On Sunday, January 6, a rare Sunday where Epiphany comes on a Sunday, we will be reminded of a star that

brought a global nature to the birth of Christ. Our preacher that Sunday will be Chris Grumm who has been a leader both nationally and globally in human, civil, women's and immigration rights. A member of Augustana, Chris was the first Vice President of the ELCA.

On Sunday, January 13 we have the Baptism of Our Lord on which we celebrate our baptisms with the words of affirmation to continue in the covenant God made with us in Holy Baptism to live among God's faithful people; to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's supper; to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed; to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth. The water sprinkled on us during worship all day that Sunday with evergreen branches from our Christmas trees will remind us of the creating and renewing power of Christ's love.

On Sunday, January 20 we will celebrate the prophetic role of the church to bring light to the places where our world must change, and the light of hope that change is truly possible in the one born in Bethlehem. The light of Christ to vision the beloved community will be lifted up as we remember the great American Prophet the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. At our 24<sup>th</sup> Annual King Jazz Gospel Service, we will focus on his "Letter from a Birmingham Jail" which reminds us why we can't wait when it comes to doing justice.

Our Annual King Service is the longest-running Sunday King Service in Portland. When we began it in 1996 it made the front page of the Oregonian with a *See next page*

large picture of children carrying candles. This sets us up well for Sunday, January 27 when we will have spirit-filled worship all day concluding with a two-hour LIFT EVERY VOICE OREGON worship event that will overflow our Sanctuary as we recommit ourselves in our interfaith effort to pass two bills we have submitted to the 2019 State Legislature. These will Ban the Sale of Assault Weapons and Large Capacity Magazines in Oregon. A January 2nd Press Conference at Augustana will announce this. Because of our joint efforts this is now a real possibility and will be a bellwether for the nation.

Yes, the light shines and the darkness cannot overcome it.

Yes, with Jesus the best is always yet to come. This is the season of Epiphany as we celebrate that Christ is the Light of the World. Let us live into this New Year as a congregation with the Light of Christ's love shining brightly for all the world to see as we vision a better world, living lives centered in faith, hope and love.

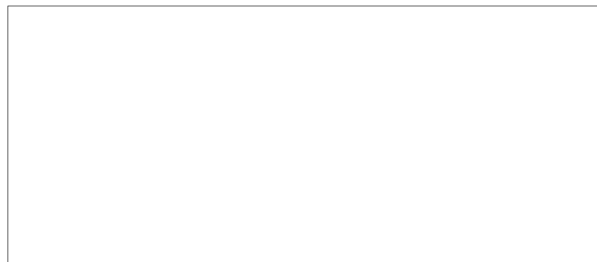
