Once while Jesus¹ was standing beside the lake of Gennesaret, and the crowd was pressing in on him to hear the word of God, ² he saw two boats there at the shore of the lake; the fishermen had gone out of them and were washing their nets. ³ He got into one of the boats, the one belonging to Simon, and asked him to put out a little way from the shore. Then he sat down and taught the crowds from the boat. ⁴ When he had finished speaking, he said to Simon, "Put out into the deep water and let down your nets for a catch." ⁵ Simon answered, "Master, we have worked all night long but have caught nothing. Yet if you say so, I will let down the nets." ⁶ When they had done this, they caught so

many fish that their nets were beginning to break. ⁷ So they signaled their partners in the other boat to come and help them. And they came and filled both boats, so that they began to sink. ⁸ But when Simon Peter saw it, he fell down at Jesus' knees, saying, "Go away from me, Lord, for I am a sinful man!" ⁹ For he and all who were with him were amazed at the catch of fish that they had taken; ¹⁰ and so also were James and John, sons of Zebedee, who were partners with Simon. Then Jesus said to Simon, "Do not be afraid; from now on you will be catching people." ¹¹ When they had brought their boats to shore, they left everything and followed him. Luke 5:1-11

To be fishers of people for the purpose of weaving God's beloved community is a calling of each congregation. We exist to be co-workers with God for a world of compassion and love, reconciliation and renewal, healing and hope.

Jesus calls the disciples to put out into the deep water with their nets. They protest because they were fishing all night with no results. Yet he commanded them to do it and they did. The rest as they say is history.

The church is not a passive group of people; rather, the church is a place of coming together to thank God for God's love and abundant blessings, called then to live a faith active in love.

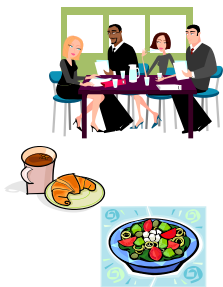
This is a day like others, when many are seeking love and acceptance. Many have

Black History Month is an annual observance of the history and accomplishments of African Americans. The month designated for the observance is February, which was chosen to coincide with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln (February 12) and Frederick Douglass (February 14). Lincoln is significant for signing the Emancipation Proclamation, which ended slavery in the United States, and Douglass for his prominence as an African American leader in the nineteenth century.

The concept for the observance originated with African American historian, Carter G. Woodson, who in 1926 called for the establishment of Negro History Week. Woodson observed that both the struggles and accomplishments of African Americans were not widely studied or recognized, and that this deficit of knowledge was unhealthy for American society in general and the African American community in particular. Woodson believed that studying and remembering the past was a prerequisite to living successfully in the present and being prepared for the future.

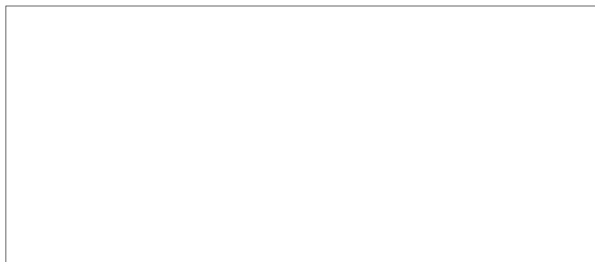
