On Ash Wednesday, March 6, we begin our 40 day Lenten journey with Christians throughout the world. This is a powerful discipline in the Christian Community as we turn and return with all that we are to the God of love who created us and gives us this life and the promise of eternal life through the life, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.

Through the Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and giving of ourselves for the good of all, we deeply connect to the love of God we have experienced in Jesus Christ. This empowers us spiritually so that we may more deeply love God, our neighbor and ourselves. We are a people of love, for that is who God is. Love is not passive but active, individually and systemically. During Lent we focus on disciplines that refine and renew us. This is vital as we

strive to be a people and a church of love that can overcome the forces of hate and division.

In this Good Newscaster you will find a Lenten brochure that outlines the Lenten rhythm through the 40 days, Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter on Sunday April 21. Beginning with services on Ash Wednesday at 12:00 noon and 7:00 pm we will move into a Lenten rhythm of a shared meal and Bible Study each Wednesday at 6:00 pm followed by the Holden Vespers at 7:15 pm. The exception to this will be Wednesday, March 20 which is my Doctoral Project Presentation Day and is explained below.

Sundays in Lent will be centering and uplifting at all of our services. Sundays are a priority for Christians in every nation and language as the hallmark of our week. Our theme throughout the Lenten Season, Holy Week and Easter will be "Always Step Out in Faith" and Matthew 25:31-46 will be at the heart of this time. I look forward to our Lenten Journey together.

## Annual Meeting Recap

The meeting was held on Sunday, February 3 with an amazing Combined Service at 10:00 a.m., the potluck at 11:30 a.m. and the packed meeting from 12:00-1:25 p.m. The meeting was chaired by Congregational President Deaconess Julia Brown, and featured Pastor Knutson's report; Vice-President Ayn Frazee led a thank-you with flowers given to everyone in attendance; the dedication of the second Youth Room and the new Wolf oven in the kitchen.

The 36-page bulletin of reports highlighted the incredible breadth and depth of the ministry of Augustana and the work of our Council, Foundation, committees, 40 servant teams, non-profit partners at Augustana and at the heart of it, our worship and discipleship education. Julia Brown (President), Anna Bandick and Chris Delaney were thanked for their 6 years (2 terms) on the Council as were Kathy Allen Kirsch (Chair) and Susan Johnson (Secretary) of the Foundation. Elected to a first term on our 18-member Council were Laurie Richardson, and Elizabeth and Robert Morse (shared position). Elected to a second term were Mark Witham and Rebekah Witham (shared position), LeAnne Jabs, and Greg Halverson. Elected to the Augustana Foundation Board were Nicole King and Ansel Johnson. Pastor Knutson shared that we have grown to 870 members and that among the 10 funerals in 2018 two were members: Amy Plumb and David Hayward.

Treasurer Ken Petersen gave our year-end budget report showing \$465,081 in Income vs \$464,684 in Expenses, putting us \$368 to the positive. The income did not include close to \$30,000 in additional benevolence Augustana generated. The elections of Council and Foundation members were unanimous, as was the approval of the 2019 budget of \$472,000 which does not include a large benevolence amount that will unfold as the year progresses. We are now boldly moving into 2019.

Rev. Knutson thanked outgoing President Julia Brown, Foundation Chair Kathy Allen Kirsch, core staff Joyce Kindschuh, Jenny Schmidt and Rebecca Dodson, all of our musicians and members.

**The Augustana Center for Systemic Change**

Through our non-profit collaborative at Augustana we are truly making a difference in many areas. When you combine the efforts of Augustana, the Community Alliance of Tenants, Irvington Cooperative Pre-school, the Society for Haitian Arts, Culture and Social Support, Lift Every Voice Oregon, Open Circle ministries, Moses Movers and our Sanctuary work, we do over 2.5 million in justice work annually at this place for the good of all.

**Systemic Change through the Oregon Legislature: Senate Bill 608** was championed by the **Community Alliance of Tenants**, passed both the House and the Senate, and is being signed into law by Governor Brown. Governor Brown was at Augustana in October on this issue. This is the first state law of its kind in the nation, putting an end to no-cause evictions and exorbitant rent increases. It applies to those who have more than four rental properties.

**Lift Every Voice Oregon**, our Interfaith Coalition at Augustana, now has two bills before the Legislature. **HB 3223** would ban the sale of assault weapons, and **HB 3265** would ban large capacity magazines. Both bills have a lot of support but will take a full court press to get through. They will be the most far-reaching actions by a state since Parkland. Volunteers are needed in the Lift office. Stop by and sign up.

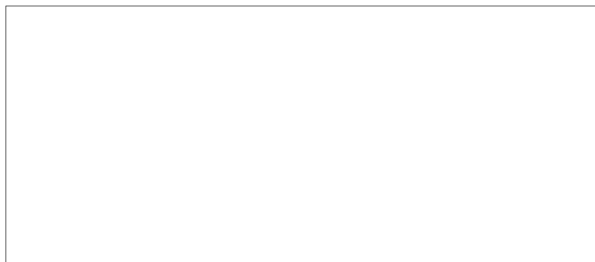
