24 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb, taking the spices that they had prepared. 2 They found the stone rolled away from the tomb, 3 but when they went in, they did not find the body. 4 While they were perplexed about this, suddenly two men in dazzling clothes stood beside them. 5 The women were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, but the men said to them, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? He is not here, but has risen. 6 Remember how he told you, while he was still in Galilee, 7 that the Son of Man must be handed over to sinners, and

be crucified, and on the third day rise again." 8 Then they remembered his words, 9 and returning from the tomb, they told all this to the eleven and to all the rest. 10 Now it was Mary Magdalene, Joanna, Mary the mother of James, and the other women with them who told this to the apostles. 11 But these words seemed to them an idle tale, and they did not believe them. 12 But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he saw the linen cloths by themselves; then he went home, amazed at what had happened. Luke 24:1-12

This year Easter Sunday, the celebration of the resurrection of our Lord Jesus Christ, is the latest it can arrive, Sunday, April 21. Spring is then in full bloom and new life is all around us.

We continue our Lenten journey the first Sunday of April, followed by the Wednesday Lenten Potluck and Bible Study, and Holden Vespers which are beautiful to sing. If you haven't attended these yet this Lent, be sure and come Wednesday, April 10.

Then we move to Palm Sunday, April 14 with an inspiring and deeply moving service taking us from Hosannas and children's processional to the reading of the Passion narrative which begins Holy Week, a week in our lives like no other. This year we want to give a special thank you to Colleen and Jerry Benson who

with their children have had Scout, the miniature horse, lead the children with palms for 15 years! We have college students who will never forget this.

We then move to Holy Week: Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter Vigil and the joy of Easter Sunday. This Easter we will gather around the empty tomb hearing the admonition as a congregation to "Rise Up and Step Out." As the public church of Easter we know those places where Jesus calls us to rise up and bring justice and peace, healing and hope, and the vision of God's intention for all of creation.

The Seder Supper is Thursday, April 18 at 5:30 p.m.
 Sign up now in the narthex. Come experience this deeply moving meal and liturgy. The Seder is one part of the present-day Jewish seven-day Passover celebration. The name Passover harks back to the time when God, through Moses, led the Israelites out of their slavery. To recall that great deliverance, the elements of the traditional Seder meal symbolize historically significant features of the Israelite experience. Both the event of God's deliverance and the directions God gave Moses for later commemoration of the Passover history are represented in the Seder ritual and meal.

The Good Friday prayer vigil is a continuous prayer time going from the end of the Good Friday Tenebrae Service to the beginning of the Easter Vigil Service on Saturday. The light of hope from Good Friday is kept burning by 100 persons keeping vigil at the cross. That same flame will light the Christ Candle at the start of Easter Vigil. Please sign up in the narthex for a 15-minute slot; we especially need coverage through the night. This is an amazing experience for all ages.

Earth Day is this month, on Monday, April 22. The fact that it coincides with Easter is prophetic. This is a year when we will redouble our work of Advocacy to save the earth and renew the creation while doing our part to green Augustana.

Lift Every Voice Oregon is in full gear with two bills at the Legislature. HB 3223 would ban the sale of assault weapons, and HB 3265 would ban large capacity magazines. We need everyone to call the legislators, email, write, or make a personal visit to demand that these bills have hearings for the sake of our children and youth. As we remember Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. on April 4, the day of his assassination, we remember his words, "Justice too long delayed is justice denied." Let's continue to act together.

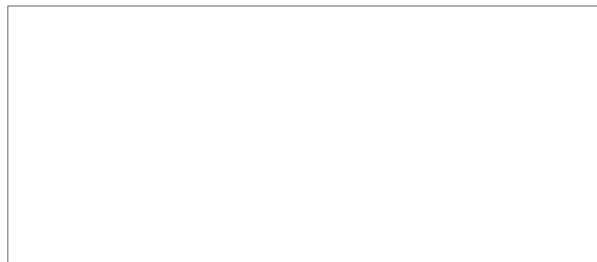
