We had an amazing Lenten Season, Holy Week and Easter again this year at Augustana. This annual journey takes us deep on our faith journey and empowers us for ministry in the year before us.

We are now in the 50 days of Easter which run up to Pentecost Sunday on June 9. The texts for the Sundays of the Easter Season are life-giving with the risen Jesus sharing Peace with his disciples causing them to rejoice, breathing on them the Holy Spirit, and cooking breakfast for them on the beach.

This Easter season Jesus offers us the same peace, the breath of life and the power of the Holy Spirit, and a weekly meal of bread and wine. These are gifts that enable us to live resurrected lives in partnership with Christ for the renewal of the creation and human lives.

In the reading from Revelations 22:1-5 we have one of my favorite passages: "Then the angel^a showed me the river of the water of life, bright as

crystal, flowing from the throne of God and of the Lamb through the middle of the street of the city. On either side of the river is the tree of life^b with its twelve kinds of fruit, producing its fruit each month; and the leaves of the tree are for the healing of the nations.

This Easter season we are called to embrace our ministry for the healing of the nations with renewed strength, with the Peace of Christ, the breath of life and the power of the Holy Spirit. We are given power for good through the waters of baptism, the bread and the wine of the Lord's supper, and the gifts of the gathered community. As Easter people we have the capacity to be agents of healing in individual lives and in all creation, working with so many others for healing and hope and life for all.

Lift Every Voice Oregon: We have two bills in the Legislature: HB 3223 to ban the sale of assault weapons and HB 3265 to ban the sale of large capacity magazines. Adult Forum Auction Discussion Report: After several years of amazing auctions, Janis Bell and Chris Grumm are taking a break and retooling for 2021. Over the next year they will work with Jenny Schmidt to set up work groups for different aspects of the auction. This is a great opportunity to establish a sustainable structure for the event and to expand the community of volunteers who help make the evening successful. The work group areas will be ticketing, procurement, volunteer coordination, wine toss and computer work. If you are able to help with any of these, please contact Jenny. This means that we will NOT be having an auction in 2020. To fill the income gap, Forum attendees brainstormed a number of creative alternatives including: dinners (spaghetti feed, fancy Italian dinner, progressive dinner, Cinco de Mayo dinner); garage sale, pop-up store, repair fair; walk-run event with money raised from pledges; dance party; speaker and a paddle raise; no-show gala/non-event (where people donate what they would have spent at the auction). The group also talked about the importance of community building as a part of fundraising, the need to increase our outreach to the community through social media and other advertising, and the need for increased focus on our own personal giving.

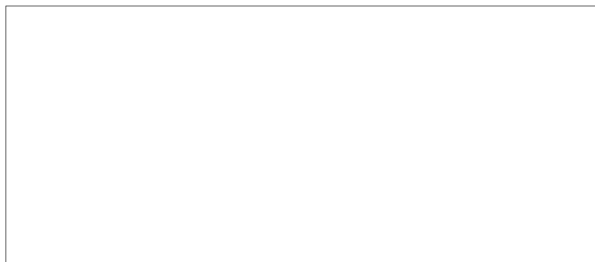
