When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of them. All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability. Acts 2:1-4

On Pentecost Sunday, June 9 as we celebrated our Sunday School and Musicians for a wonderful program year, we also celebrated the birth of the whole church 2000 years ago and Augustana 113 years ago in 1906. During the sermon we asked everyone at each service to stand and say their name and where they were born. The results were a witness to the church of Pentecost, of every nation and every people not just in our global village but right here at Augustana. By the end of the day we had 33 states of birth represented, the District of Columbia, and 10 countries of birth outside the US along with four tribal nations and the US. This amazing diversity of people were gathered, enlightened and sent by the Holy Spirit on one Sunday on the corner of 15th and Knott at Augustana Lutheran Church in Portland, Oregon!

Later that night I went through the roster of the church and could add another 10 countries of birth, several more Sovereign Tribal Nations and it appears that almost all 50 states plus DC are represented in our Congregation. This is truly a gift of the Holy Spirit and a strong foundation upon which to serve and grow as a community of faith committed to sharing the good news of God's love and grace that we experience in Jesus Christ as we continue to strive for Justice and Peace in all the earth!

The other great news of the early summer as we move fully into the season of Pentecost are the 18 graduations from High School, College and advanced degrees that we are aware of in the congregation to date. These graduates of Augustana will be working all over the world, which again underscores the beauty of God's global village we are gifted with.

Lifted up in prayer as we continue to accompany them are Mahsa Heydari (Iran) and Francisco Aguirre (El Salvador) as they seek Asylum and serve as a beacon of hope and sanctuary for so many others including ourselves.

Our two Lift Every Voice Oregon bills in the State Legislature are before the Legislature. **HB3223** bans the future sale of assault weapons, and **HB3265** would ban large capacity magazines. Right now we are encouraging everyone to contact the Legislature in support of **HB 2505**. We need everyone to call the legislators, email, write, or make a personal visit to demand that these bills have hearings for the sake of our children and youth. As we remember Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr's words, "Justice too long delayed is justice denied," let's continue to act together. A letter signed by 155 clergy members in support of gun legislation was sent to the Legislature.

Pastoral Care at Augustana: Pastoral Care is always readily available at Augustana for baptisms, first communions, prayers prior to surgery as well as hospital visits, home visits when homebound, wedding officiating and pre-marital counseling, initial counseling when requested that generally will lead to a professional reference after two visits, funeral planning and officiating, discernment when faced with important life decisions, and ongoing home communion and visits for those who are no longer able to attend church. Children and Youth Ministry is strong and there is a weekly Monday morning women's prayer group led by lay and clergy volunteers. This care does not

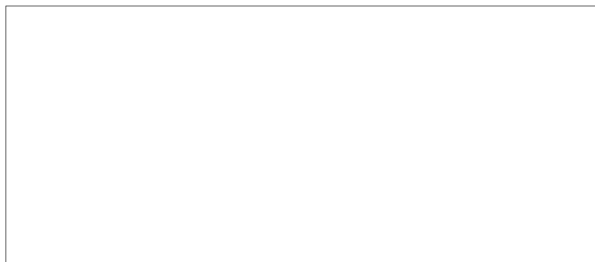
