“Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it.” *Hebrews 13-1-2*

This passage from Hebrews 13 is one of the four appointed readings for Sunday, September 1 which will lead us into a wonderful month of worship and programs for the coming year. Who knows who we will welcome at Augustana and who we may meet and be welcomed by in the community and God's good world.

One thing we do know, that by declaring ourselves a Sanctuary Congregation in 1996 to underscore our welcome of the immigrant and refugee, as angels in our midst, we have been a catalyst leading to the recent action regarding sanctuary at our Churchwide Assembly in Milwaukee, Wisconsin. For it was your work at Augustana as one of only a few Sanctuary congregations in the country in the 1990's, it was your work in becoming the first home to the Interfaith Movement for Immigrant Justice after it was born in 2006, it was your bold witness in welcoming Francisco Aguirre for 81 days in Sanctuary at Augustana in 2014 while at the same time becoming a founding member of the National New Sanctuary Movement, that helped lead to this moment when the ELCA as a whole has become the nation's first Sanctuary Denomination at this critical time in history.

The catalyst, the leaven for this came in April 2016 when our Augustana delegation carried a resolution to the Oregon Synod Assembly that led to this moment. The resolution read as follows:

RESOLVED, that the Oregon Synod endorse and fully support the existing Sanctuary congregations of the Oregon Synod, and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Oregon Synod declare itself one of the first Sanctuary Synods in the ELCA while encouraging all congregations to become Sanctuary churches ready to protect refugees and undocumented sisters and brothers from arrest and deportation by Immigration and Customs Enforcement officers (ICE), and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Oregon Synod memorialize the 2016 Churchwide Assembly of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America to declare itself the first denomination in the country to call itself a Sanctuary denomination, encouraging all 10,500 Lutheran churches to become Sanctuary congregations.

The 2016 Oregon Synod Assembly passed this overwhelmingly and the 2016 Churchwide Assembly "received with gratitude the memorial of the Oregon Synod (written by Augustana) regarding the Sanctuary movement." Now, three years later, the 2019 Churchwide Assembly fulfilled our call by declaring the ELCA the first Sanctuary Church Body in the nation. From the corner of NE 15th and Knott came an action that is giving hope to refugees and immigrants and calling our nation to change!

As we approach Rally Day with the beginning of our Sunday School, Confirmation, High School and Adult Education

classes let's continue to *Let mutual love continue* as we teach our children and ourselves values born of faith in the Risen Christ that welcome the stranger with compassion and love, faith and hope as together we weave the beloved community where all have life.

Augustana Special Preachers Series: Book Signing and Sermon with Civil Rights Leader Dr. LeRoy Haynes Sunday, September 22 at 5:00 p.m.

Dr. LeRoy Haynes, senior pastor of Allen Temple CME Church in Portland will give a talk on his book about the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. with whom he marched entitled "GOD'S PROPHET IN NON-VIOLENCE" on Sunday September 22 at 5:00pm. He will be the preacher at the Jazz Service. Dr. Haynes was an organizer for the Southern Christian Leadership Conference (SCLC) and for the Student Non-Violent Coordinating Committee (SNCC) in the state of Texas. He co-organized the Black Panther Party in Dallas, Texas and helped to expand it across the state. He currently serves as chairperson of the Albina Ministerial Alliance for Justice and Police Reform and is a past President of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon. Pastor Knutson wrote the introduction to his book. **Coming on October 6 will be Chris Grumm** who was the first Vice President of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America in 1988 and a global woman's non-profit advocate preaching on the topic of "GENEROSITY" at all services. **On Sunday November 10 we will have a BIG BAND (14 MEMBERS) JAZZ BENEFIT FOR REFUGEES AND IMMIGRANTS** with Marilyn Keller and Pastor Mark working with a renowned band leader. 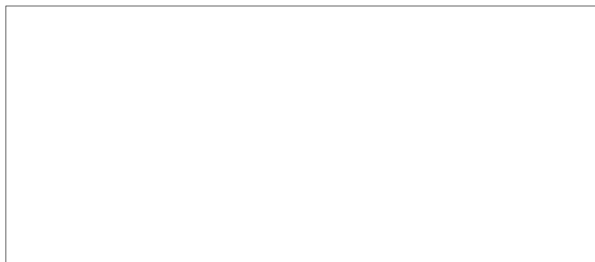
