As we enter this New Year of 2020 beginning with the last of the 12 days of Christmas that take us up to the Epiphany of our Lord, we enter it declaring that Jesus, God's word in the flesh, full of grace and truth is the light unto our path and the light for the nations.

In ministry with the 10,000 churches of the Evangelical Lutheran Church of America (ELCA), as part of a worldwide communion as the church catholic and as human beings who honor the practices of our siblings of other faith traditions and people of every land and place of good will, we embrace together this year before us.

The birth of Jesus reminds us that we celebrate Emanuel, God with us, and that his presence is with us in every aspect of life. The celebration of Christmas at Augustana with over 1000 in attendance at our four services with great energy and a profound relational sense of community reminded us of the hope we have in the one born to Mary and Joseph in a manger in Bethlehem as angels sang and shepherds rejoiced with all of creation.

This Epiphany Season we revel in the fact that Jesus came as a light to the nations that we might fully know God's love for all as we are then called to fervently love one another.

Entering 2020 we rejoice that God has called us to shine the light of Christ as a Multicultural, Multinational, Multigenerational Sanctuary Congregation of Justice Seekers and Peace Makers. This calling in this place and time gives us the courage to step out boldly in faith on the issues of our day, from gun violence to violence between nations, or among peoples, or violence against the creation itself. As a public church we are called to bear hope and healing as we weave God's beloved community where every person's life is seen as sacred.

We will celebrate Epiphany on January 5, the Baptism of our Lord on January 12, and the life of the modern day prophet the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. on January 19. We will hear more from our

Generosity team as our Advocacy Team prepares us to Lift Every Voice at the February short session of the legislature. This month we prepare to give thanks to God for our life together at Augustana with our Annual Meeting through worship, a feast and a celebratory meeting on Sunday, February 9.

Now for one of the most exciting aspects of 2020. We at Augustana can only be a church with a strong voice in the public square and a place of healing and hope for every person by being centered in Word and Sacrament. This gives us the wisdom and the energy to do our ministry together for the common good and the good of every person.

So in 2020 we will embark on another complete reading of the Bible from cover to cover. This year we will begin the process with the reading of Ruth. This is, as you know, the story of two courageous women. This ties well with the 100 year celebration in this country of the Right for Women to vote and the courage of women and their allies to obtain it, at least for some, until the voting rights act of the 1960's. We will begin this reading of the Bible on Sunday, January 12. On Sunday, January 19 we will move to Matthew which will be our primary Gospel source for 2020. On Sunday, January 26 it will be Genesis and then we will read it in sequence. Each week you will receive a one-page introduction to the book to be read.

Thy Word is a lamp unto our feet and a light unto our path, we declare. This is going to be another remarkable year of ministry together and with the community around us. May we enter it with joy as we immerse ourselves in God's living word together and reflect God's love in word in the world today.

Augustana Members' Asylum Updates: We continue to celebrate with Mahsa Heydari that her asylum was granted in Federal court on September 11.

Francisco Aguirre was granted a full

year before his next required check-in as he seeks asylum.

The ELCA is the first Sanctuary Denomination in the country. This action by our denomination was driven by a resolution that Augustans took to the Oregon Synod in 2016 which made Oregon the first Sanctuary Synod and called for the ELCA to do so. Four other synods joined our call and now the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America has. Good work, Augustana, in leading the nation!

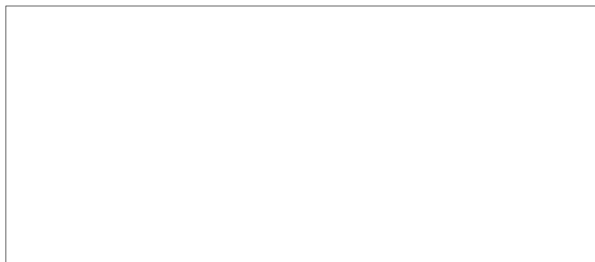
