¹³ Jesus said to her, “Everyone who drinks of this water will be thirsty again, ¹⁴ but those who drink of the water that I will give them will never be thirsty. The water that I will give will become in them a spring of water gushing up to eternal life.” ¹⁵ The woman said to him, “Sir, give me this water, so that I may never be thirsty or have to keep coming here to draw water.” John 4:12-15

The encounter of Jesus and the woman of Samaria is one of the great stories of scripture. This Gospel text for Sunday March 15 of two people who in that day should not have had a conversation at the well in the noonday heat reveals once again for us who God is.

They were separated by culture, gender, social norms, prejudices, implicit biases, inequity, community judgement, and the list goes on. Yet in this chance encounter by the well, we see hospitality to a stranger that leads to the water of life. Jesus asks for a drink, the woman responds to his request not only with water but with questions, and her life is changed forever.

This is one of the longest lectionary texts we have, almost like an act of a Shakespeare play with people coming and going with many layers of intrigue and discovery. The story ends with the Samaritan woman going and telling everyone what Jesus has done for her, and in her telling, the lives of others are changed forever, as

they come to know the living Christ, the true water of life.

This season of Lent that we are now fully in, a time of prayer, fasting, almsgiving, doing justice, and baptismal preparation, as we remember our own baptisms and splash in the water of life, our spirits are renewed and we are empowered to share good news of God’s love for every person on the face of this earth. A love that can overcome all human barriers and bring us into new and life-giving relationships.

In this election year, fraught now with the uncertainty of the coronavirus in every part of the globe, our call to renewed relationships of love and of service as we journey to the cross of Good Friday and the joy of Easter Dawn is as important as ever. How we as the church address the virus and the political season, with hospitality and the water of life, with compassion and love, wisdom and understanding, grace and gratitude for all that God has done for us, will be the public witness that these times are calling for.

Yes Lord, we thank you for this living water; renew us and use us that we may witness to your life-giving love this Lenten Season and always.

Annual Meeting Recap

The meeting was held on Sunday, February 9 with an amazing Combined Service at 10:00 a.m., the potluck at 11:30 a.m. and the packed meeting from 12:00-1:25 p.m. The meeting was chaired by Congregational President Ayn Frazee, and featured reports from the Pastor, Treasurer, Council President, all committees, groups, and servant teams, and the proposed budget for 2020.

The 35-page bulletin of reports highlighted the incredible breadth and depth of the ministry of Augustana and the work of our Council, Foundation, committees, 40 servant teams, non-profit partners at Augustana and at the heart of it, our worship and discipleship education. Ayn Frazee, Fiona and Duncan Taylor, Gabrielle and Ken Petersen were thanked for their 6 years (2 terms) on the Council. Elected to a second term on Council were Susan Nieman, Ramona Nieman, Robert Trimble, Wayne Reitz, and Todd Gienapp. Elected to a second term on the Augustana Foundation Board was Edward Running. Pastor Knutson shared that at Dec. 31, 2019 we were 866 members and that among the 15 funerals in 2019, eight were members.

Treasurer Ken Petersen gave our year-end budget report showing \$462,006 in Income vs \$442,074 in Expenses, putting us \$19,931 to the positive. The income includes close to \$22,000 in additional benevolence Augustana generated. The elections of Council and Foundation members were unanimous, as was the approval of the 2020 budget of \$468,000 which does not include a large benevolence amount that will unfold as the year progresses. We now move boldly into 2020.

Rev. Knutson thanked outgoing Council President Ayn Frazee, outgoing council members Ayn Frazee, Fiona and Duncan Taylor, Gabrielle and Ken Petersen; core staff Joyce Kindschuh, Jenny Schmidt and Rebecca Dodson, all of our musicians and members.

The Cornerstone II Staffing Research Team chaired by Pastor Knutson held two meetings in February as they work on potential scenarios to share with the congregation in late spring.

Lift Every Voice Oregon IP 60 Signature-Gathering Trainings to begin in March: Two one-hour training sessions at Augustana to kick off the statewide trainings will be held: Tuesday, March 24 at 6:30 p.m., and Saturday, March 28 at 10 a.m.. These are for all ages. Our goal is for 150,000 signatures to meet the 112,000 required by Friday, July 3.

The Sound Team led by Joe Paterno has been at work for over two years and has moved through the Church Council and the Foundation for the approval of the upgrade plan and the funding. This is an exciting project to be completed by Easter.

Familias en Accion located at Augustana) Latinx Healthy Equity Conference, Friday, June 12, 2020. This is the largest conference of its kind in the Northwest, with over 400 attending at the DoubleTree Hotel. This year's conference will

VIVA inclusive migrant network birthed at Augustana, in partnership with the National Day Laborers Organizing Network funded with Meyer Memorial Trust and Collins Foundation grants. More to come!

Augustana Members' Asylum Updates: We continue to celebrate with Mahsa Heydari that her asylum was granted in Federal court on Sept. 11.

Francisco Aguirre was granted a full year before his next required check-in as he seeks asylum.

The ELCA is the first Sanctuary Denomination in the country. This action by our denomination was driven by a resolution that **Augustans** took to the Oregon Synod in **2016**, making Oregon the first Sanctuary Synod and calling for the ELCA to do so as well. Four other synods joined our call and now the Evangelical Lutheran

Church in America has. Good work, Augustana, in leading the nation!

Albina Ministerial Alliance for Justice and Police Reform: The Steering Committee of the AMA, of which Pastor Knutson is a member, has met monthly at Augustana for the past 10 years and is the first Ministerial Alliance in the nation to be granted Enhanced Amicus status. We were in Federal Court on Feb. 25 with Judge Michael Simon.

The Augustana Center for Systemic Change includes Familias en Accion; Irvington Cooperative Preschool; VIVA; Lift Every Voice Oregon; Society for Haitian Arts, Culture, & Social Support; Open Circle Ministries; the Augustana New Sanctuary Institute, and ongoing work with Habitat for Humanity.

Pastoral Care: Pastoral Care is readily available at Augustana for baptisms, first communions, prayers prior to surgery as well as hospital visits, home visits when homebound, wedding officiating and pre-marital counseling, initial counseling when requested that generally will lead to a professional reference after two visits, funeral planning and officiating, discernment when faced with important life decisions, and ongoing home communion and visits for those who are no longer able to attend church. The weekly prayer list of the congregation is also there for names to be added **as requested**. Children and Youth Ministry is strong and there is a weekly Monday morning women's prayer group led by lay volunteers. This care does not just come from our lead pastor, there are others in the congregation, both lay and clergy, who are able to assist. A real key to care at Augustana are the deep relationships that have been created and the way you care for one another which is at the heart of how a congregation should function. 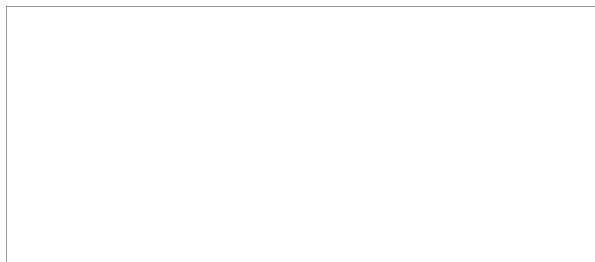
