Merry Christmas and Happy New Year to all as we begin the year of our Lord 2021 filled with the hope that Christmas and the celebration of the birth of Christ brings us. We experienced that light of Christ as we ended 2020 with two virtual events that drew thousands to Augustana with over 3000 views for our Christmas Eve Candlelight service and over 1700 views of our special Christmas Concert. We will enter 2021 worshipping together through livestream with the 10:00 a.m. service in English and the 11:30 a.m. service in Spanish. On Sunday, January 17 we will host the Albina Ministerial Alliance Martin Luther King Celebration as part of our 25th Annual King Service which is the longest running King Sunday Service in Oregon. Continue to invite others this month so they may experience the Faith, Hope and Love that we share in Christ.

Yes, we begin this year 2021 knowing that God who is faithful will lead us and guide us into a new day. For out of every crisis and storm in life God can do something new. Yes, this Christmas and Epiphany season let us always remember that the light of Christ shines and as we celebrate our own baptism this month let us “Let our lights so shine before others that they may see our good works and glorify our God in heaven.”

Augustana Solar Project Team Updates

We are still in the running for two grants for a solar energy system for the Education Building roof: Pacific Power Blue Sky, and PCEF. Both organizations are scheduled to announce their awards in February. Although we had a strong application, we did not receive the Pacific Power Electric Mobility grant. We were told that preference was given to applicants in rural areas. Since 2008, however, our primary

objective has been to install solar power to meet the electricity needs of the church and our non-profit partners.

The Italian takeout fundraiser, held in November, to benefit the Solar Project Fund was a great success. The final tally of funds raised exceeded \$4400, netting nearly \$4000 after expenses. Details will be coming soon about Italian Takeout Fundraiser #2 in mid-February!

Lift Every Voice Oregon, located at Augustana, continues preparing for the 2021 Legislature to see that important gun violence prevention legislation moves forward. The LEVO Youth Leadership Academy was an important step along the way as is the coordination of some 3000 volunteers around the state.

The Augustana Center for Systemic Change: Familias en Accion is doing amazing work in the midst of the Covid-19 crisis, including food distribution from Augustana's parking lot every Friday; the **Library bond** lead staff is officed at Augustana; **Jobs with Justice** has been housed at Augustana since June; and the **VIVA Inclusive Migrant Network** completes its first year. Of course all staff members of these partners are primarily working from home.

The Albina Ministerial Alliance Coalition for Justice and Police Reform (Pastor Knutson is part of the Steering

Committee that has a seat in the Federal Court) The AMA Steering Committee has met every month at Augustana for the past eight years, and the general meetings are the first Thursday at 5 p.m. at Maranatha Church on 12th and Skidmore. All are welcome to the general committee meetings.

Legislative Advocacy: Teams from Augustana continue to advocate around specific justice issues from Health Care for All to Gun Safety, Police Reform, Homelessness, Fair Wages and other key topics. Email the church if you would like to assist.
